

What is Children's Bible Drill?

Children's Bible Drill is a program to help children in grades 4-6:



- Increase in the knowledge of the Bible
- Develop skills in locating all Bible books and 10 key passages
- Memorize the names of the books of the Bible in order and 25 Bible verses and 10 Key Passages identified on the current Verse Cards
- Learn how to apply the Bible to their lives

During a drill, Drillers are given 10 seconds to step forward with the correct response. Children who participate in the Church Drill and have 12 or more correct responses out of 24 advance to the Association Drill. If they have 16 or more correct responses at the Association Drill, they advance to the State Drill at Webster Conference Center in Salina, KS on Saturday, April 19, 2008. Children who have 20 or more correct responses at the State Drill are declared winners and will receive a pendant on a blue ribbon. Perfect score winners will receive a pendant on a purple ribbon.

Churches may choose to use the NIV or the Holman Christian Standard (HCSB) Bible for Children's Bible Drill. Cycles for each year are as follows:

2007-2008—Green Cycle

2008-2009—Red Cycle

2009-2010—Blue Cycle
